AGENTS IN PSP ATTEMPT HARASSMENT OF LATIN LEFTISTS CLOSE TO LABOR COMMITTEES

NEW YORK, Oct. 17 (IPS)--In a last-ditch attempt to stop the growing hegemony of the National Caucus of Labor Committees and the Latin American Labor Committees in Latin communities throughout the United States, the CIA-controlled right wing of the Puerto Rican Socialist Party (PSP) has launched a campaign of harassment against former PSP members who have joined or come around the Labor Committees in the past few weeks.

The attacks are aimed directly against Labor Committee exposure of the CIA's plan to provoke race riots to divert the enormous ferment in Latin communities from working-class organizing into suicidal in-fighting between groups of workers. In reality the goals of these groups are identical: To stop the Rockefellers' plan for fascism, and to create workers governments worldwide within the next few years.

Based on our organizing the Labor Committees have the political credibility to blow the PSP wide open in the U.S. Along with the Revolutionary Union and the Socialist Workers Party, the PSP is one of the CIA's major U.S. countergang-type networks. The Labor Committees intend to pull out of the PSP the entirety of its pro-working-class membership. This potential is driving the agents within the PSP and their controllers into hysteria.

Desperate Moves

This hysteria has led them to stupid, desperate moves. Oct. 4 a car belonging to Ramon Ayala and Carmen Caceres was destroyed by fire--just three days after they officially joined the Labor Committees. Yesterday, the car of Juan Caceres, Carmen Caceres' brother, also was burned. Juan is not a member of the Labor Committees but has been so identified recently because of his close work with the Latin American Labor Committees.

The Labor Committee Security Staff has identified the arsonist as an agent-provocateur inside the PSP. This person had been pointed out to the leader of the U.S. branch of the PSP, Ramon Arbona, as an agent by both Carmen Caceres and Ramon Ayala many months ago. The agent in question is well known to other PSP members as an inciter to semi-terrorist activities in that group. He has taken credit for many "rip-offs," and claims to have been a member of ROTC--where he may have been recruited or brainwashed into the ranks of CIA operatives. Just before the attack on Ayala's car, the agent was heard to say that he was "out to get Ramon's ass."

In Philadelphia last Saturday, Oct. 12, the PSP declared its intentions to "blow away" Labor Committee organizers. When New Solidarity salesmen arrived at a regular distribution site, nine PSP goons were stationed at the corner of 5th and Canbria Streets --normally a spot where there would be only two PSPers peddling their counterinsurgent rag Claridad.

NCLC Warns Agents of Exposure Before Working Class :

The Labor Committees have issued a public warning that if any harm comes to Carmen Caceres, Ramon Ayala, or Juan Caceres, their children, or any members of their families, the Labor Committees and the working class will hold responsible both the PSP and the individuals mentioned above.

PSI CLASS TRAITORS URGE WORKERS TO FOLLOW BRITISH EXAMPLE

Oct. 17 (IPS)--The same factions in the Italian Socialist Party (PSI) which have carried out slanders and goon attacks against the European Labor Committees this week initiated a propoganda campaign aimed at the desperate Italian working class. These PSI factioneers proposed to Italy's trade unions and workers that they follow the example of the British Labour Party. As the Labor Committees have documented, the Labour Party is run entirely by the Rockefeller-funded Tavistock Institute in London, pioneers in brainwashing and psychological warfare.

Three speeches reported in the PSI newspaper Avanti Oct. 15 bring out this theme explicitly. Francesco DeMartino, the Socialist Party secretary and leader of the majority faction, called for "courageous political decisions which first of all will succeed in getting the workers' consensus, just as occurred in Great Britain, on the line indicated by the Labour Party."

DeMartino was echoed by the Socialist parliamentary group leader Mariotti who held out a "new order in national society... meaning contact with the unions, an important political fact which permitted the Labourists themselves to get an absolute majority."

Finally, PSI central committee member and president of the Tuscany regional government Lelio Lagorio announced: "The PSI in substance asks that Wilson's example be followed. Against the strategy of our conservatives, who like the British ones are advancing an anti-crisis program founded on a total no to the neediest classes and defiance of the unions, the PSI--like the Labour Party--counterposes a program of harsh austerity but supported by the unions, with many no's but some yes's capable of tying the masses to the institutions."
