FOOD EXPORT BANS DICTATED AT ROME

ROME, Nov. 6 (IPS)—At a secret meeting of the major food producers held during the World Food Conference here, Rockefeller henchman and FAO head A.H. Boerma dictated the terms of his bosses' food control policy: food exports to the advanced countries, especially Western Europe and Japan, are to be slashed by trade controls and the food is to be diverted into a "food reserve." Henry Kissinger backed these plans to spread starvation to the advanced countries by threatening any nation which did not participate with being cut off entirely from the world food market—a food export ban.

The implementation of these new moves to destroy food productio and distribution comes at a time when John D. Rockefeller III's final solution to the opulation problem is already being carried out on a mass scale in the "skeleton camps" of Bangladesh, India and the Sahel.

The export control plan, the details of which are still secret, will endanger the flow of about 25 million tons of food which is imported annually by Japan, Britain, Germany, Italy, the Metherlands and Belgium. Although food consumption of these countries will be reduced to subsistence levels, without a doubt none of the food diverted will find its way to Rockefeller's Fourth World exterminations. The Kissinger visit to India and Bangladesh, which resulted in the pledging of a tiny 600,000 tons of aid to the two countries, the cutting off of all US aid to large areas of the Sahel, the brutal refusal to aid Honduras at a time when the U.S. alone holds more than 15 million tons in grain, all demonstrate that the decision to starve the Fourth World is already made. The food diverted from workers' tables will go into "food reserve banks," to be doled out as Rockefeller pleases.

SOVIET IMACTION

In the face of Rockefeller's brutal imposition of food control and famine on the advanced countries and his elimination thus far of millions of Asians, Africans and Latin Americans, the Soviet Union has done nothing. In fact, the Soviets have placed themselves on the verge of providing a left cover for genocide. They have actually gone so far as to attend the secret meetings where Boerma and the other flunkies have dictated the food export controls and have agreed to consider participating in the schemes.

Rockefeller's cops have done their best to make sure the International Caucus of Labor Committees is not around to bust up their plans as it did at the Bucharest Population Conference. Not only were attempts made to bar IPS correspondents, officially accredited by the UM, from the proceedings, but outside the conference twelve ICLC organizers were beaten up by the Rome police as they distributed a leaflet exposing the conference and the cannibals behind it.

COUNTERGANG COVER

To conceal Rockefeller's guilt for the extermination camps of Bangladesh and the slashing of advanced country consumption through trade controls, the conference set up a propaganda barrage to push Rockefeller's plans under suitable left rhetoric. The "Roman Forum," a collection of 26 minor Goebbels led by Barbara Ward and Rockefelle foundation President John H. Knowles, blames the "too fat" workers of the advanced countries for Rockefeller's starvation of Bangladesh The "Forum" advocates immediate food rationing in North America and West Europe to provide more food for aid.

THE TRILATERAL'S SUGGESTION

The Roman Forum is flanked by the so-called Transnational Institute, fielded for the occasion by the CIM-funded Institute for Policy Studies based in Mashington, D.C. They too propose a "radical solution: technology doesn't work in the Third World; farmers should get money with investment control centralized in an international body. In other words, those chosen third world sectors should put their life blood and labor power in hock to Chase Manhattan, farmer by farmer.

The worst travesty in the whole Roman arena is the left border-guard role played by the Italian Communist Party (PCI), whose newspaper, L'Unita has embraced the "radical" proposals of the countergangs — workers in the advanced sector must sacrifice "democratically" for the starving third world. Citing arch-cannibal and known CIA agent Rene Dumont, L'Unita attributes the problem to "the cannibalism of the 'center' in regard to the 'periphery'." Once again, the PCI has fallen lock, stock and barrel for the CIA line fashioned to set up "greedy" industrial workers throughout the advanced sector for the chopping block along with their third world brothers.
