FORRESTER'S NAZI "SCIENCE" SPREADS THROUGH ACADEMIA

Nov. 4 (IPS)--Last month, HIT professor and author of Limits to Growth Jay Forrester received a medal from the Franklin Institute for his advocacy of "food triage"--the selective withholding of food as a means of eliminating "unwanted" population growth. Forrester recommended the limiting of agricultural production as well as halting exports in order to accomplish his genocidal goal. Since the Franklin Institute conference, other self-styled "scientists" and academics--their morality long ago destroyed by Rockefeller control of university funding and jobs--have joined the campaign to make mas starvation "acceptable."

Dr. Philip Mandler, president of the Mational Academy of Scienc has released a statement arguing that since population growth has outstripped food production, the developed nations may have to "forget" South Asia. "Cruel as it may sound," Dr. Handler said, "if the developed nations do not intend the colossal all-out effort commensurate with this task, then it may be wiser to let nature take its course as Aristotle described it: 'From time to time it is necessar that pestilence, famine, and war prune the luxuriant growth of the human race'."

Handler nevertheless concludes on a "humanitarian" note, stating that developed countries are to avert the "economic disasters, resentments, and terrorism" stemming from Third World starvation by diverting immense amounts of capital to the poorer countries for "development" purposes. This will require, he said, that they cut down drastically on their own per capita (i.e., working class) income.

What Handler, Forrester, and the other Nazi doctors systematically ignore in their "doom and gloom" projections of limited resources is the availability of nuclear fusion power technology—a nearly infinite, non-polluting energy source which can be harnessed for industrial and agricultural expansion. The professors' "oversight" is not merely accidental, but betrays their ultimate subservience to the Rockefeller oil interests which for years have sabotaged the development of fusion power through their control of the Atomic Energy Commission.

LABOR PARTY EXPOSES ANTI-COOP MOVE

Nov. 3 (IPS)--Ray Martino, the U.S. Labor Party candidate for New York State Attorney General, released a statement decrying the "so-called anti-trust measures of the U.S. Justice Department."

Martino said, "Under the cover of fighting inflation, U.S. Treasury Secretary Simon and Attorney General Saxbe have launched an 'anti-trust' offensive actually aimed at destroying farmer-owned cooperatives. The 'Watergating' and jailing of two leaders of the

largest dairy coop, Associated Milk Producers, Inc., was a warning shot fired for every political farmer and farm organization. Although thousands of U.S. dairy farmers go bankrupt and leave production each month, they don't put up any real fight.

"Actually, most farmers haven't the slightest notion of how to fight this assault and they will continue to go down to defeat as long as they organize simply around higher prices. The 'farmers' crisis' is not really just a farm problem. It is an intermational attack on workers' food supplies launched by the Rockefeller family through the squeeze on farm credit and an energy hoax which tripled fertilizer and fuel prices. Farmers who want to fight this international enemy—Rockefeller—have only one choice: Join the U.S. Labor Party's farmer—worker alliance."
