The U.S. House of Representatives on Tuesday <u>passed an amendment</u> that would prohibit funding for transgenic edible vaccines — vaccines grown in genetically engineered plants for consumption by humans or animals.

The <u>amendment</u>, introduced by Rep. Thomas Massie (R-Ky.) to the agricultural appropriations bill <u>H.R. 4368</u>, would bar the U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) and the U.S. Food and Drug Administration (FDA) from funding the vaccines for fiscal year 2024. (Childrens' Health Defense)
