There are a lot of trivia and intelligence tests online, but I thought I would offer you something a little different. You can either take this test or just look at it, as you wish. No one will ever know your score. In a paper on the SAT, I reminded you that test is not very old. It came out of the Army about a hundred years ago, but before that college entrance exams were much longer and harder. High school or prep school seniors in the US or UK would be tested on actual knowledge in many subjects before winning a place at Oxford, Cambridge, Harvard, Yale, or other colleges of that caliber. So I thought it might benefit us to see what they knew. That will help us understand what we do NOT know—a very important part of any education.

Unlike so-called IQ tests, there are no questions here on word jumbles, simple stated math problems, or pattern recognition. As I have reminded you recently, that is the way they have decided to measure native intelligence, hard as it is to believe. Which explains why the superhigh-IQ have never done much of anything except sit on the pages of the Guinness Book of World Records and make crossword puzzles. There are also no questions here on Hollywood, sports, TV, pop music, current politics and literature, or pop culture in any other form.

I do this for several reasons. One, many readers have asked me for a new syllabus for homeschooling children. I have already overwritten so much history and science we now need a whole new set of textbooks. This test won't really address that question, but it will point us in the right general direction. In my opinion, before overwriting history we need to reverse it many decades, and this test will show one way to do the first part. Two, this will remind us how far we have fallen in just one hundred years. As such, it will be just one more testament to the failures of our “leaders”.

This test is actually much shorter than the old entrance tests, but it will stand as an example of what they contained. Some of these questions would be considered tough even to the most highly educated, and I am not implying prep school seniors would know all of them, or even a majority. If you know everything at age 18, why go to university at all? But top seniors 100 years ago would know more of these than you might imagine. Top college grads would know even more. [See University Challenge on Youtube.] They were actually “prepped” for college and life, not just babysat in pep rallies and gender studies.
